



Welcome to God's House

Death can sting in many ways. It can sting by casting a shadow over every moment of life. No matter what earthly joy you are experiencing, death guarantees it won't last. Second, death can sting by separating loved ones. There are no phone calls or hugs from the dead. Third, death can sting by



instilling fear of what follows. Deep down, every human being senses that after death there is some sort of reckoning. . . a judgement. Yes, death can sting in many ways.

Note that word "can." Because he lives, death has lost its sting for those who put their faith in the

living Lord. Because Christ lives, we have all the proof we need that God accepted Jesus' death as the complete and final payment for all our sins. Those who are in Christ need no judgment. There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ. Moreover, Christ's resurrection is the assurance that our Christian loved ones aren't lost. We'll see them again in the resurrection. Christ's resurrection means we will rise to a world of incomprehensible and unending joy. Because he lives, death has lost its sting.


1 Corinthians 15:51-57

Luke 24:1-12

On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: ⁷ 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' " ⁸ Then they remembered his words.

⁹ When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. ¹⁰ It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹ But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. ¹² Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb.




 In Christ alone my hope is found; he is my light, my strength, my song;
